AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE APPOINTMENT OF A CHIEF OF INSPECTIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would
2 tend to defeat its purpose, which is, in part, to provide
3 for the immediate appointment of a chief of inspections
4 in the department of public safety in case of a vacancy
5 in said office, therefore it is hereby declared to be an
6 emergency law, necessary for the immediate preserva-
7 tion of the public safety and convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 22 of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by striking out section 4, as
3 amended by section 33 of chapter 591 of the acts of
4 1946, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 section:—

6 *Section 4.* Upon the expiration of the term of office
7 of a state fire marshal, his successor shall be appointed
8 by the governor, with the advice and consent of the
9 council, for three years. He shall receive such salary
10 as may be fixed under and in accordance with sections
11 forty-five to fifty, inclusive, of chapter thirty.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter 22 is hereby further

2 amended by inserting after section 4 the following
3 section: —

4 *Section 4A.* The commissioner shall appoint a chief
5 of inspections who shall not be subject to the provisions
6 of chapter thirty-one, and who may be removed only
7 for cause. He shall receive such salary, not exceeding
8 fifty seven hundred and sixty dollars, as the governor
9 and council may determine.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon the
2 expiration of the term of office of the present incum-
3 bent of the office of chief of inspections in the depart-
4 ment of public safety, or upon the occurrence of a
5 vacancy in said office, whichever first occurs.
