
By Mr. Wondolowski of Worcester (by request), petition of Ignacy Jaszek and others for admission to the Soldiers' Home in Massachusetts of certain persons who served in the military service of Poland during World War I. Military Affairs and Public Safety.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ADMISSION TO THE SOLDIERS' HOME IN MASSACHUSETTS OF CERTAIN PERSONS WHO SERVED IN THE MILITARY SERVICE OF POLAND DURING WORLD WAR I.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any person who served in the military service
2 of Poland while said country was allied with the
3 United States during World War I shall be entitled
4 to admission to and hospitalization in the Soldiers'
5 Home in Massachusetts; provided, that he produces
6 information in conformity with the rules and regula-
7 tions of said home, that he has been honorably dis-
8 charged from said service, and is a citizen of the
9 commonwealth and has a legal settlement in a city
10 or town therein, or if not such a citizen is a citizen
11 of the United States and has such a settlement; but
12 no such person shall be admitted as aforesaid if the
13 admission thereto of any veteran, as defined in section
14 twenty-one of chapter thirty-one of the General
15 Laws, would thereby be postponed or denied.
