AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR SEPARATE TAX BILLS FOR THE
THE SUPPORT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of
2 chapters fifty-nine, sixty and sixty A of the General
3 Laws, and any other provisions of law, the assessors,
4 when committing the annual tax list with their
5 warrant to the collector of taxes, shall make a separate
6 tax list and warrant for the amount to be raised by
7 taxation for the support of the public schools as
8 required by chapter seventy-one of the General
9 Laws and notify the collector of the proportion
10 which the annual school appropriation as voted by
11 the school committee bears to the total sum to be
12 raised by taxation in said year, and also the amount
13 of the annual tax rate required therefor. The assessors
14 shall similarly notify the collector of the amount to
15 be raised by taxation in said year.

1 SECTION 2. The collector shall forthwith, in
2 accordance with said chapters sixty and sixty A,
3 after receipt of such tax list, warrant, and said notice,
4 send to each person assessed, resident or non-resident,
5 the amount of his tax for the support of said schools.
6 Such tax bill shall be captioned "Annual School
7 Bill". The collector shall similarly send to each
8 person assessed under chapter fifty-nine, General
9 Laws, the amount of his tax bill to meet the amount
10 required for the balance of the total amount to be
11 raised by taxation in said year.
