AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN GRADUATES OF THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS ELIGIBLE TO BE EXAMINED FOR REGISTRATION AS QUALIFIED PHYSICIANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of section
2 two of chapter one hundred and twelve of the Gen-
3 eral Laws, as amended, or of chapter three hundred
4 and sixty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and
5 forty-six, as amended, all persons who were residents
6 of this commonwealth at the time of their matricula-
7 tion at the College of Physicians and Surgeons, and
8 who received the degree of doctor of medicine there-
9 from prior to January sixteenth, nineteen hundred
10 and forty-seven, and all persons not residents of this
11 commonwealth who received the degree of doctor of
12 medicine from the College of Physicians and Surgeons
13 prior to January sixteenth, nineteen hundred and

14 forty-seven, and who shall have interned in a chari-
15 table or municipal or United States veterans' hospital
16 within the commonwealth said internship having com-
17 menced prior to said January sixteenth, nineteen hun-
18 dred and forty-seven, shall be eligible to be applicants
19 for registration as qualified physicians, shall be exam-
20 ined for such registration by the board of registration
21 in medicine, and shall be subject to and have the
22 benefit of all pertinent provisions of law relative to
23 such eligibility and examination, to the same extent
24 as if they had **matriculated** at said school of medicine
25 prior to January sixteenth, nineteen hundred and
26 forty-seven.
