By Mr. Chapman of Boston, petition of Frank J. McFarland for legislation to establish the salaries of the board of assessors of the city of Boston. Cities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE SALARIES OF THE BOARD OF ASSESSORS OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 93 of the special
2 acts of 1918, as most recently amended by chapter 257
3 of the acts of 1938, is hereby amended by striking
4 out said section 2 as amended and inserting in place
5 thereof the following new section 2: —

6 *Section 2.* The mayor of the city shall appoint, and
7 may at any time remove, in accordance with the pro-
8 visions of chapter four hundred and eighty-six of the
9 acts of nineteen hundred and nine, five assessors to
10 hold office for terms of one, two, three, four, and five
11 years, respectively, from the first day of April in the
12 year nineteen hundred and thirty-eight. As the term
13 of each assessor expires, the mayor in like manner
14 shall appoint his successor for a term of five years
15 from the first day of April in the year of appointment.

16 The mayor shall also fill any vacancy for the unexpired
17 term. The mayor shall designate the chairman of the
18 board who shall receive an annual salary of eight
19 thousand dollars; the four other members of the
20 board shall each receive an annual salary of seven
21 thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its
2 acceptance by the mayor of the city of Boston, sub-
3 ject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.
