AN ACT MAKING EMPLOYEES OF LOCAL HOUSING AUTHORITIES ELIGIBLE TO MEMBERSHIP IN THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF THE COMMONWEALTH OR THE LOCAL COMMUNITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Regular employees of local housing authorities and  
2 of the state housing board are hereafter eligible to  
3 membership in the retirement systems of the city or  
4 town in which employed or in the retirement system  
5 of the commonwealth in the same manner as other  
6 employees of local or state departments.
