AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EQUIPMENT OF CERTAIN MOTOR BUSES AND COACHES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Every common carrier of persons by motor bus or
2 coach shall equip each bus or coach operated by it
3 with automatic sanding equipment. Whoever vio-
4 lates the provisions of this act shall be punished by a
5 fine of not more than one hundred dollars for each
6 offence.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I
Section 1
All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2
The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3
The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature of the State in which they may be, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
