AN ACT PLACING UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS THE OFFICES OF FOREST FIRE PATROLMEN AND FOREST FIRE OBSERVERS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The offices of forest fire patrolmen and forest fire
2 observers in the department of conservation which
3 are subject to the supervision of the state fire warden
4 shall, upon the effective date of this act, become sub-
5 ject to the civil service laws and the regulations made
6 thereunder and the tenure of office of the incumbents
7 of such offices shall be unlimited, subject, however,
8 to said civil service laws.
