AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TENURE OF OFFICE OF CHARLES DICICCO, AN INVESTIGATOR IN THE VETERANS' SERVICES DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF SOMERVILLE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The tenure of office of Charles DiCicco,  
2 a disabled war veteran, and employed as an investi-  
3 gator in the veterans' services department in the city  
4 of Somerville, upon passing a qualifying examination  
5 to which he shall be subjected by the civil service,  
6 shall be unlimited, subject to the civil service laws,  
7 and he shall be deemed to be permanently appointed  
8 thereto without being required to serve any proba-  
9 tionary period.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
