AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE PUNISHMENT OF PERSONS
GUILTY OF MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE BY IMPRISON-
MENT IN STATE PRISON FOR LIFE IN CERTAIN CASES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 265 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out section 2, as appearing in the Tercen-
3 tenary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the fol-
4 lowing section: —

5 *Section 2.* Whoever is guilty of murder in the first
6 degree shall suffer the punishment of death, unless the
7 jury shall by their verdict, and as a part thereof, upon
8 and after consideration of all the evidence, recommend
9 that the sentence of death be not imposed, in which
10 case he shall be punished by imprisonment in the state
11 prison for life; and whoever is guilty of murder in the
12 second degree shall be punished by imprisonment in
13 the state prison for life.
