### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT OF BENEFITS TO THE PARENTS OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES KILLED IN INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 Section 31 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as  
2 most recently amended by chapter 666 of the acts of  
3 1948, is hereby further amended by adding at the  
4 end thereof the following paragraph:—

5 The surviving parent or parents of an unmarried  
6 child who at the time of sustaining an injury resulting  
7 in his death was living with his parent or parents  
8 shall be paid twenty-five hundred dollars in such  
9 cases where dependency has not been shown.
