By Messrs. Folsom of Lynn and Boot of Lynn, petition of Harold J. Hanlon that waiting periods be eliminated under the Employment Security Law. Labor and Industries.

AN ACT ELIMINATING THE WAITING PERIODS UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 151A of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out section 23, as most
3 recently amended by section 3 of chapter 534 of the
4 acts of 1943, and inserting in place thereof the fol-
5 lowing section: —

6 *Section 23.* An individual who is in total or partial
7 unemployment and who registers at an employment
8 office or other place of registration maintained by the
9 director or has otherwise given notice of his unem-
10 ployment in accordance with the procedure pre-
11 scribed by the director shall be eligible for benefits
12 for unemployment sustained with respect to the bene-
13 fit year to which the claim applies, which benefit
14 year includes the week for which he claims payment
15 for benefits.

1 SECTION 2. All references in chapter one hundred
2 and fifty-one A to a waiting period are hereby stricken
3 therefrom.
