AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN
VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 The provisions of section 58 of chapter 32 of the
2 General Laws shall hereafter apply to veterans of
3 World War II except that the period of thirty years
4 shall be twenty years in the case of such a veteran.
