## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN POLICE OFFICERS AND FIREMEN OF CERTAIN CITIES AND TOWNS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by striking out section 85G, inserted by chapter 483  
3 of the acts of 1948, and inserting in place thereof the  
4 following:—

5 *Section 85G.* Any member of a police or fire depart-  
6 ment who is hereafter retired under the provisions of  
7 sections eighty to eighty-five F, inclusive, who was  
8 appointed a reserve police officer or reserve fireman  
9 prior to July first, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven,  
10 shall, for the purposes of such retirement, be credited  
11 with the period of such service as such reserve police  
12 officer or reserve fireman as a part of his continuous  
13 service.
