## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF ASSESSORS OF THE CITY OF SOMERVILLE SHALL BE ELECTED BY THE VOTERS OF SAID CITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The board of assessors of the city of  
2 Somerville shall consist of five members, to be elected  
3 at large by and from the voters of said city.

1 SECTION 2. At the biennial municipal election  
2 to be held in said city in the year nineteen hundred  
3 and forty-nine, the members of the board of assessors  
4 shall be elected by and from the registered voters  
5 of the city, and the first three in the order of votes  
6 received shall serve for terms of four years each,  
7 and the remaining two shall serve for terms of two  
8 years each. At each biennial municipal election  
9 thereafter, successors to the members of said board

10 to be elected thereat shall be elected for four years  
11 each.

1 SECTION 3. All members of the existing board of  
2 assessors of said city shall cease to hold office upon  
3 the qualification of the members of the board of  
4 assessors elected at the biennial municipal election in  
5 the year nineteen hundred and forty-nine.
