## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY OF WORCESTER TO ACQUIRE ADDITIONAL LAND AND RIGHTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF INCREASING ITS WATER SUPPLY AND TO BORROW MONEY FOR THAT PURPOSE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The city of Worcester, for the purpose  
2 of constructing or of reconstructing and maintaining  
3 dams, standpipes, pumping stations and reservoirs  
4 upon its source of water supply heretofore acquired  
5 and hereinafter to be acquired, and of preserving and  
6 protecting the purity of the water, may take by  
7 purchase or otherwise and hold in fee or otherwise  
8 such lands, easements and rights of way in the towns  
9 of Holden, Princeton and Rutland and in the city of  
10 Worcester, as the city council of the city of Worcester  
11 may from time to time judge necessary.

1 SECTION 2. The rights, powers and authority given  
2 by this act shall be exercised by the city of Worcester  
3 by the same officers in whom are vested the rights,  
4 powers and authority given by chapter one hundred  
5 and four of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and  
6 sixty-four, and said city shall be entitled to all the  
7 rights and subject to all the duties and liabilities set  
8 forth in chapter three hundred and sixty-one of the  
9 acts of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-one,  
10 to be enforced in the manner provided in said chapter.

1 SECTION 3. The city of Worcester for the purpose  
2 of defraying all costs and expenses incident to the acts  
3 herein authorized and for constructing or reconstruct-  
4 ing dams, standpipes, pumping stations, reservoirs  
5 and other necessary expenditures in connection with  
6 the improvement, development, enlargement and  
7 extension of its water system within or without the  
8 boundaries of the city of Worcester, is hereby au-  
9 thorized to borrow from time to time within a period  
10 of five years from the passage of this act such sums as  
11 may be necessary, not exceeding in the aggregate three  
12 million dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor  
13 which shall bear on their face the words Worcester  
14 Water Improvement Loan, Act of 1949. Each au-  
15 thorized issue shall constitute a separate loan and such  
16 loans shall be payable in not more than twenty years  
17 from their dates. Indebtedness incurred under this  
18 act shall be in excess of the amount authorized by  
19 chapter two hundred and eleven of the special acts  
20 of nineteen hundred and sixteen as amended by chapter  
21 one hundred and thirty-eight of the acts of nineteen  
22 hundred and twenty and in excess of the amount  
23 authorized for such purposes by chapter forty-four of

24 the General Laws. Except as provided herein in-  
25 debtedness incurred under this act shall be subject  
26 to the applicable provisions of said chapter forty-  
27 four.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
