The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF BEAM OR OTTER TRAWLS
IN TAKING FISH FROM CERTAIN TERRITORIAL WATERS
OF MASSACHUSETTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 454 of the acts of 1948 is
2 hereby amended by striking out section 1 and inserting
3 in place thereof the following:—

4 *Section 1.* It shall be unlawful, except between
5 November first and the following March thirty-first,
6 both dates inclusive, for any person to use beam or
7 otter trawls to drag for fish in that part of the terri-
8 torial waters of Massachusetts lying between a line
9 extending from the water tower on Winthrop Head
10 through the Graves Light and a line drawn from the
11 Gurnet Light to Race Point Light to the marine
12 boundary of the commonwealth.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.

It is the duty of the House to see that the public interest is protected in the disposal of the property of the Government.

The Government of the Philippines

Section 1. The Government of the Philippines shall be organized as follows:

1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the President of the Philippines.

2. The Legislative Power shall be vested in the Congress of the Philippines, which shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

3. The Executive Power shall be exercised by the President, who shall hold office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election only once.

4. The President shall have the honor and the dignity of the office, and shall be the chief executive officer of the Government.

5. The President shall have the right to grant pardons and reprieves, and to commute sentences, but shall not have the power to grant amnesty.

6. The President shall have the right to appoint and remove officers and employees in his department, and to grant them such honors and distinctions as may be conferred by law.

7. The President shall have the right to call upon the armed forces of the Philippines, and to direct their operations.
