AN ACT PROVIDING A FORTY HOUR WORK WEEK FOR FOREMEN EMPLOYED BY THE CITY OF LAWRENCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any
2 general or special law, the service of all persons em-
3 ployed by the city of Lawrence as foremen shall be
4 restricted to forty hours in any one week; provided,
5 that the service of such foremen in excess of forty
6 hours in any one week may be authorized by the officer
7 of the city or other person whose duty it is to employ,
8 direct or control such foremen, and such additional
9 service shall be compensated for as overtime. The
10 compensation now payable to such foremen shall not
11 be reduced by reason of the provisions of this act.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance by the city council of the city of Lawrence,
3 subject to the provisions of its charter, but not other-
4 wise.
