AN ACT PLACING UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS THE POSITION OF CLERK OF WORKS IN THE TRANSIT DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON, AND RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF THE INCUMBENT OF SAID POSITION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The incumbent of the position of clerk
2 of works in the transit department of the city of
3 Boston on the effective date of this act shall be sub-
4 jected to a qualifying examination for said position
5 by the division of civil service. If said incumbent
6 passes said examination, he shall be certified for said
7 position and shall be deemed to be permanently ap-
8 pointed thereto, without serving any probationary
9 period.

1 SECTION 2. Said incumbent, upon his permanent
2 appointment as aforesaid, shall be permitted to be a
3 member in the Boston retirement system as of the
4 date of his original appointment to said position,
5 and he shall be permitted to pay into the annuity
6 savings fund of said system an amount equal to that

7 which his account therein would be if he had been a
8 member in said system since said date.
