HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, June 27, 1949.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom were referred the Bill relative to the exemption from local taxation of property owned by the United States and of property of the Commonwealth (House, No. 1050), the Resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special commission relative to the erection within the Commonwealth of a statue or other suitable memorial to commemorate the late Governor Benjamin F. Butler (House, No. 1467), the Bill providing for the construction, maintenance, repair and operation of a Boston stadium, providing for the creation of the Boston stadium authority and defining its powers and duties and providing for the financing of said project (House, No. 1474), and the Bill providing for the construction and maintenance by the Metropolitan District Commission of a memorial stadium in the city of Boston (House, No. 1768), report the accompanying order (House, No. 2631).

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

*Ordered*, That the Joint Committee on Ways and Means, in addition to its investigation and study of all matters pertaining to the finances of the Commonwealth, is hereby authorized to investigate and study the following bills: — House, No. 1050, relative to the exemption from local taxation of property owned by the United States and of property of the Commonwealth; House, No. 1768, providing for the construction and maintenance by the metropolitan district commission of a memorial stadium in the city of Boston; House, No. 1474, providing for the construction, maintenance, repair and operation of a Boston stadium, providing for the creation of the Boston stadium authority and defining its powers and duties and providing for the financing of said project; House, No. 1467, resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special commission relative to the erection within the Commonwealth of a statue or other suitable memorial to commemorate the late Governor Benjamin F. Butler. In the discharge of its duties hereunder said committee may sit during the recess of the General Court and may travel within and without the Commonwealth, and for the purposes of this order may expend the balance remaining in item 0102-25 on June 30, 1949, for the 1950 fiscal year. Said Committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives from time to time, but not later than June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and fifty.
