To accompany the petition of Joseph H. Leddy for legislation to increase the membership of the Board of Collegiate Authority. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT INCREASING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF COLLEGIATE AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 15 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out section 3A, as appearing in section 3
3 of chapter 652 of the acts of 1946, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following:—

5 *Section 3A.* There shall be in the department a
6 board of collegiate authority, consisting of the com-
7 missioner, who shall be chairman, the members of the
8 board of education, and five citizens of the common-
9 wealth to be appointed by the governor, with the
10 advice and consent of the council, for terms of four
11 years each. Of the appointive members of said
12 board, at least one shall represent colleges and uni-
13 versities, one shall represent junior colleges, one
14 shall be an administrator of a private proprietary
15 business school, and one shall represent the secondary

16 school system of the public schools of the common-
17 wealth. The members of said board of collegiate
18 authority shall serve without compensation, but shall
19 be reimbursed for their necessary expenses actually
20 incurred in the performance of their duties.
