

SENATE No. 244

To accompany the petition of Edward C. Peirce that payments of claims under the employment security law shall commence within thirty days after application therefor, unless denied. Labor and Industries.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT PAYMENTS OF CLAIMS UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW SHALL, IF THE CLAIM IS NOT DENIED, COMMENCE WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER APPLICATION THEREFOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 40 of chapter 151A of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the
3 following paragraph: —

4 Payments of claims for benefits, unless the claim
5 is denied, shall commence not later than thirty days
6 after the filing of each claim. The provisions of this
7 paragraph shall apply to all claims for benefits filed
8 as original claims or filed after decision on appeal,
9 or review by the courts.
