To accompany the petition of Robert G. Dodge and others that provision be made for a pension for the reporter of decisions of the Supreme Judicial Court. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING A PENSION FOR THE REPORTER OF DECISIONS OF THE SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by inserting after section 65B, inserted by section 1
3 of chapter 689 of the acts of 1941, the following new
4 section: —
5 *Section 65C.* A reporter of decisions of the supreme
6 judicial court, who, after having served as such at
7 least ten years continuously and having attained the
8 age of seventy years, shall resign his office, shall there-
9 upon be entitled to receive a pension for life at an
10 annual rate equal to three fourths of the annual rate
11 of salary paid to him at the time of such resignation,
12 to be paid from the same source and in the same
13 manner as his salary was paid at the time of such
14 resignation.
