AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF TWO EMPLOYEES OF THE LAND COURT WITH THE TITLE OF DEPUTY ASSISTANT CLERK WHO MAY PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE CLERK OF COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 185 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby
3 amended by inserting after the word "court", in
4 line 8, the words:— and may designate, with like
5 approval, two employees, having the title of deputy
6 assistant clerk,— so that the last sentence of said
7 section will read as follows:— The recorder may,
8 with the approval of the judge, appoint two assistant
9 clerks of court and may designate, with like approval,
10 two employees, having the title of deputy assistant
11 clerk, who shall, under his direction, perform the
12 duties of clerk of court.
