To accompany the petition of Daniel H. Murphy and Charles V. Hogan for legislation to establish the minimum retirement allowances or pensions of former public employees at seven hundred and fifty dollars. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE MINIMUM RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES OR PENSIONS OF FORMER PUBLIC EMPLOYEES AT SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY DOLLARS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of general or special
2 law, the minimum retirement allowance or pension
3 paid to any former employee of the commonwealth
4 or of any political subdivision thereof shall be seven
5 hundred and fifty dollars per annum.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty

ARTICLE XXXI. THE MINIMUM ALLOWANCE FOR POLITICAL EXPENSES ON POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS AT
ELECTORAL CONVENTIONS AND ELECTIONS.

The amount to be paid by the State and Towns of the several
counties shall be ascertained, and by the authority of the
Board of State Officers, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding any provision of general or special law, the minimum allowance for political expenses shall be paid to any former member of the commonwealth.
2. If any political subdivision thereof shall be seven hundred and fifty dollars per annum.
