To accompany the petition of Ralph C. Mahar that provision be made for the establishment of a minimum retirement allowance under the teachers' retirement law. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE UNDER THE TEACHERS' RETIREMENT LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The minimum retirement allowance
2 for public school teachers retired under Option A of
3 the teachers' retirement law, as provided by chapter
4 thirty-two of the General Laws, shall be fourteen
5 hundred dollars, any provision of general or special
6 law to the contrary notwithstanding.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January
2 first, nineteen hundred and fifty-one, and shall apply
3 to all teachers retired both prior and subsequent to
4 said effective date.

To recognize the position of the Senate in the House of Representatives, the Senate shall have the right to request the House to furnish it with a copy of the records of the House, and the House shall comply with such request.

The Constitution of the State of New York

In the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty

THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, in regular session, do hereby certify that the following is a true and correct copy of the Constitution of the State of New York.

It is hereby ordered by the Senate and House of Representatives, that the following is a true and correct copy of the Constitution of the State of New York, as amended.

SECTION 1. The highest judicial authority shall be the Court of Appeals, which shall be composed of five Justices, one of whom shall be the Chief Justice. The Justices shall be elected by the people for a term of ten years, and shall hold office until their successors are elected. The Court of Appeals shall have the power to review the decisions of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, and shall have the power to issue writs of habeas corpus, certiorari, and mandamus.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January 1, 1950, and shall apply to all cases pending in the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court and to all cases pending in the Court of Appeals, and shall apply to all cases pending in the Court of Appeals and to all cases pending in the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court.
