AN ACT REQUIRING CITIES, EXCEPT BOSTON, AND TOWNS
TO INDEMNIFY POLICE OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO SPECIAL
DUTY FOR CERTAIN EXPENSES OR DAMAGES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Section 100 of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as
2 amended, is hereby further amended by inserting
3 before the last sentence the following sentence:—
4 This section shall also be construed to require a city
5 or town to indemnify, in the manner and to the extent
6 herein provided, any regular member of its regular
7 police force who is assigned to special duty by a su-
8 perior officer for expenses or damages sustained by
9 such member in the performance of such duty.
