AN ACT PROVIDING FOR FIVE YEAR TERMS FOR THE TREASURER AND THE COLLECTOR OF TAXES IN THE CITY OF MALDEN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city council of the city of Malden,
2 as soon after its organization as may be convenient, in
3 years when it organizes, otherwise on the first Monday
4 in January, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient,
5 shall quinquennially choose, by joint ballot in con-
6 vention, a treasurer and a collector of taxes, who shall
7 hold their offices respectively for the term of five years
8 next ensuing and until the qualification of their re-
9 spective successors; provided, that any of such officers
10 may be removed at any time by the city council for
11 sufficient cause. Vacancies occurring in the above-
12 named offices may be filled at any time by concurrent
13 vote of the city council. The compensation of such
14 officers shall be fixed by concurrent vote of the city
15 council.

1 SECTION 2. So much of chapter one hundred and
2 sixty-nine of the acts of eighteen hundred and eighty-
3 one, and acts in amendment thereof or in addition

4 thereto, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this
5 act is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on January
2 first, nineteen hundred and fifty-one.
