AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE PLACING OF THE OFFICE OF JANITOR IN THE SEVERAL PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND IN THE COMBINED TOWN HALL AND HIGH SCHOOL BUILDING IN THE TOWN OF SOUTH HADLEY UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The office of janitor in the several
2 public school buildings and in the combined town hall
3 and high school building in the town of South Hadley
4 shall, upon the effective date of this act, become sub-
5 ject to the civil service laws and rules, and the term
6 of office of any incumbent thereof shall be unlimited,
7 except that he may be removed in accordance with
8 such laws and rules; but any person holding said
9 office on said effective date may continue therein;
10 provided, that he passes a qualifying examination to
11 be given by the division of civil service.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter sixty of the acts of nineteen
2 hundred and fifty-one is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall be submitted for accept-
2 ance to the voters of said town at the annual town
3 meeting in the current year in the form of the follow-
4 ing question, which shall be placed upon the official
5 ballot to be used for the election of town officers at
6 said meeting: — “Shall an act passed by the General
7 Court in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-two, en-
8 titled ‘An Act to authorize the placing of the office of
9 janitor in the several public school buildings and in
10 the combined town hall and high school building in
11 the town of South Hadley under the civil service
12 laws’, be accepted?” If a majority of the votes in
13 answer to said question is in the affirmative, this act
14 shall thereupon take full effect, but not otherwise.
