The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN
POLICE OFFICERS AND FIREMEN OF CERTAIN CITIES
AND TOWNS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of sec-
2 tion eighty five G of chapter thirty-two of the General
3 Laws, any member of a police or fire department of
4 any city or town which accepts this act as hereinafter
5 provided, who is hereafter retired under the provisions
6 of sections eighty to eighty-five F, inclusive, of said
7 chapter thirty-two, and who was appointed a reserve
8 police officer or reserve fireman prior to July first,
9 nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, shall, for the pur-
10 pose of such retirement, be accredited with his service
11 as such reserve police officer or reserve fireman as a
12 part of his continuous service.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect in a city upon
2 its acceptance by the city council, subject to the pro-
3 visions of the charter, and in a town by vote of the
4 town at a town meeting.
