AN ACT TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS OF CERTIFICATION OF TEACHERS IN THE MASSACHUSETTS PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 38G of chapter 71 of the General Laws,
2 as inserted by chapter 278 of the acts of 1951, is hereby
3 amended by striking out after the word "board" in
4 line 13, the following "; except that evidence that the
5 applicant possesses a bachelor's degree shall not be a
6 condition precedent to the granting of a certificate to
7 applicants for teaching positions in grades up to and
8 including the fifth."
