AN ACT CHANGING THE NAME OF THE APPELLATE TAX BOARD AND THE TITLES OF ITS MEMBERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

9 respectively, to mean the tax court of Massachusetts,
10 the chief judge of said court and the judges of said
