AN ACT TO PROVIDE CERTAIN INFORMATION TO SPECI- TATORS AT BOXING MATCHES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 147 of the General Laws is hereby amended
