AN ACT TO CREATE AND APPOINT SUPERVISORS AND INVESTIGATORS BY AND FOR THE INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENT BOARD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. There shall be attached and appointed  
2 to the Industrial Accident Board supervisors and in-  
3 vestigators to investigate all industrial accidents and  
4 report the results to the industrial accident board and  
5 make recommendations to the commissioners regard-  
6 ing the said case.

1 SECTION 2. The appointments shall be made by  
2 the commissioner of the industrial accident board.  
3 They shall have permanent tenure after a permanent  
4 appointment.

1 SECTION 3. They shall be paid on the following  
2 scale: supervisors five thousand dollars, investigators  
3 forty-five hundred dollars and other investigators  
4 four thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 4. The commissioner shall be the judge  
2 of the qualifications necessary.
