AN ACT PROHIBITING THE CHARGING OF CERTAIN FEES BY CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 No city or town shall impose a fee on the operation
- 2 of a radio, television set or juke box in a hotel, cafe
- 3 or other place of public assembly on the Lord's day.
