### AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN CHANGES IN THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Subdivision (1) of section 10 of chapter 32 of the  
2 General Laws, as amended by section 1 of chapter 784  
3 of the acts of 1951, is hereby further amended by  
4 inserting after the word "sixty-five" in line 21 the  
5 words: — and, provided further, that if such member  
6 has completed twenty or more years of creditable  
7 service and has attained age fifty-five, and if such  
8 member has paid the full amount of total regular  
9 deductions permitted by subdivision (3A) of section  
10 three and by paragraph (d) of subdivision (1) of section  
11 twenty-two, the normal yearly amount of his retire-  
12 ment allowance shall not be less than the sum of his  
13 annuity, which shall be the actuarial equivalent of his  
14 accumulated regular deductions at his attained age

15 on the date the allowance becomes effective, and a  
16 pension equal to the sum of not less than one third  
17 of his average rate of regular compensation received  
18 for the two-year period of his creditable service sub-  
19 sequent to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and  
20 thirty-two, during which such rate was the highest.
