## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PROHIBITION OF CERTAIN CHARGES BY GAS, ELECTRIC AND TELEPHONE COMPANIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Gas and electric companies shall not make any  
2 separate, distinct or additional charge in addition to  
3 the price for the consumption of gas and electricity  
4 as registered on the meter. Monthly charges made  
5 by telephone companies for temporary service shall  
6 be at the same rate as monthly charges for permanent  
7 service. All laws inconsistent with this act are hereby  
8 repealed.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.  
SECTION 1. The Board of Registration of the State shall have the honor to certify to the several cities, towns and villages, the names of the persons who are entitled to vote at the next general election, and to issue to each of them a copy of the same, together with a copy of the laws relating to the registration of voters, and to cause the same to be printed and distributed to the several cities, towns and villages, and to the several persons entitled to vote at the next general election.
