By Mr. Snow of Natick, petition of William F. Wells and others (selectmen) and others that the Commissioner of Conservation be authorized to grant an easement in certain state land to the town of Natick for sewer purposes. Conservation.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

RESOLVE AUTHORIZING THE GRANTING TO THE TOWN OF NATICK OF AN EASEMENT IN CERTAIN STATE LAND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE BY IT OF A MAIN SEWER IN AND ACROSS SAID LAND.

1 *Resolve*, That the commissioner of conservation, on
2 behalf of the commonwealth, is hereby authorized to
3 grant to the town of Natick, by instrument or instru-
4 ments approved by the attorney general, an easement
5 or easements in land of the commonwealth, held by the
6 department of conservation in said town, for the con-
7 struction and maintenance by said town of a main
8 sewer and extensions thereof in and across said land.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted to or separated from the Union on the basis of one Representative for every thirty thousand Persons.

But no Representative shall have less than two Years Residence in that State in which he shall be chosen, and he shall, when elected, have seven Years Residence in the United States.

The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State, but no Senator or Representative shall be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen, and no Person shall be Representative of that State who, when elected, shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and seven Years Residence within that State.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted to or separated from the Union on the basis of one Representative for every thirty thousand Persons.
