The committee on Military Affairs and Public Safety, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by so much of the Governor's Address (Senate, No. 1) as relates to an extension of the provisions of laws for the benefit of veterans to those who have served or are now serving in the armed forces in Korea (page 45), the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 340) of Harold Putnam that provision be made for the payment of a veterans' bonus to veterans of the campaign in Korea, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1008) of Richard R. Caples and David J. O'Connor for suitable recognition of Massachusetts residents who served in the armed forces of the United States during the Korean conflict, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1316) of William X. Wall and C. Gerald Lucey that benefits of the veterans' bonus be extended to residents of the Commonwealth serving under the flag of the United Nations, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1549) of Philip A. Tracy and James A. Burke for suitable recognition of residents of Massachusetts who have served in the armed forces of the United States under the flag of the United Nations, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1828) of Timothy J. McInerney for suitable recognition of residents of Massachusetts who have served in the armed forces of the United States under the flag of the United Nations, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 2202).

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO PROVIDING SUITABLE RECOGNITION OF THOSE RESIDENTS OF MASSACHUSETTS WHO HAVE SERVED IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES DURING THE PRESENT EMERGENCY.

1    *Resolved*, That the special commission established  
2 by chapter eighty-two of the resolves of nineteen  
3 hundred and fifty-one for the purpose of making an  
4 investigation and study relative to providing suitable  
5 recognition of those residents of Massachusetts who  
6 have served in the armed forces of the United States  
7 while engaged in hostilities under the flag of the  
8 United Nations, or in a state of war arising out of and  
9 as a result of such hostilities, by extending to such  
10 persons the rights, privileges and benefits granted to  
11 veterans of World War I and World War II, including,  
12 but not limited to, those rights, privileges and benefits  
13 relating to civil service, housing, retirement and  
14 veterans' bonus, in the course of its investigation and  
15 study, shall consider the subject matter of so much  
16 of the governor's address, printed as current senate  
17 document numbered 1, as relates to an extension of  
18 the provisions of laws for the benefit of veterans to  
19 those who have served or are now serving in the armed

20 forces in Korea; the subject matter of current house  
21 document numbered 340, relative to providing a  
22 veterans' bonus for veterans of the campaign in  
23 Korea; of current house document numbered 1008,  
24 relative to providing suitable recognition of those  
25 residents of Massachusetts who shall have served in  
26 the armed forces of the United States during the  
27 Korean conflict; of current house document numbered  
28 1316, relative to extending benefits of the veterans'  
29 bonus, so called; of current house documents num-  
30 bered 1549 and 1828, relative to providing suitable  
31 recognition of those residents of Massachusetts who  
32 shall have served in the armed forces of the United  
33 States during the existing war.
