Ordered, That the committee on Banks and Banking, in making its investigation of the advisability of providing that borrowers and purchasers on credit shall have the right of anticipating payment of their obligations (under an order adopted by the House of Representatives on July 17, and by the Senate on July 23, 1951), shall consider the subject matter of current house document numbered 124, relative to prohibiting banks from advertising the services of their departments which render legal services, or from, in any way, soliciting the use of such services.
