RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SURVEY AND STUDY TO BE MADE BY THE UNPAID COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO STUDY AND REVISE THE LAWS RELATING TO RETIREMENT SYSTEMS AND PENSIONS.

1 *Resolved*, That the special unpaid commission, es-
2 tablished by chapter fifty-two of the resolves of nine-
3 teen hundred and fifty-one, and revived and contin-
4 ued by chapter _____ of the resolves of the
5 current year, to make a survey and study of the laws
6 of the commonwealth relating to retirement systems
7 and pensions with a view to the revision, codification
8 and simplification of chapter thirty-two of the Gen-
9 eral Laws, the recommendation of such changes therein
10 and additions thereto as may appear necessary and
11 desirable, and particularly to the elimination of cross
12 references and inserting in place thereof a delineation
13 of sections referred to, shall, in the course of its survey
14 and study, consider the subject matter of current house
15 document numbered 2383, that the town of Shrews-
16 bury be permitted to accept certain sections of the
17 retirement laws.
