RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND STOPPING THE PAUPERIZATION OF INJURED WORKERS AND THEIR DEPENDENTS UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW, AND PROVIDING RELIEF FOR CERTAIN INJURED WORKERS AND THEIR DEPENDENTS UNDER SAID LAW.

1 *Resolved*, That the judicial council be requested to
2 investigate the subject matter of current house docu-
3 ment numbered three hundred and fifteen, relative
4 to declaring an emergency and stopping the pauperi-
5 zation of injured workers and their dependents under
6 the workmen's compensation law; and of current
7 house document numbered nine hundred and twenty-
8 five, relative to declaring an emergency and providing
9 relief for certain injured workers and their dependents
10 under the workmen's compensation law; and to
11 include its conclusions and its recommendations, if
12 any, in relation thereto, together with drafts of such
13 legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the
14 same, in its annual report for the current year.
