AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN CHANGES IN THE RETIREMENT LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 28H of chapter 32 of the Gen-
2 eral Laws, inserted by section 2 of chapter 807 of the
3 acts of 1949, is hereby amended by striking out, in
4 line 11, the words "state employees' retirement sys-
5 tem, as provided in this chapter," and inserting in
6 place thereof the words: — any contributory retire-
7 ment system of the commonwealth or of any of its
8 political subdivisions.

1 SECTION 2. Subdivision (2) of section 10 of chapter
2 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
3 out paragraph (b) and inserting in place thereof the
4 following: —

5 (2) (b) Any member classified in either Group A or
6 Group B, who has completed six or more years of
7 creditable service, and who, before attaining age
8 fifty-five, fails of nomination or re-election, or fails to
9 become a candidate for nomination or re-election, or
10 fails of reappointment, or is removed or discharged
11 from his office or position without moral turpitude on
12 his part, or any such member whose office or position

13 is abolished, who leaves his accumulated total deduc-
14 tions in the annuity savings fund of the system of
15 which he is a member, shall have the right upon at-
16 taining age fifty-five, or at any time thereafter, to
17 apply for a termination retirement allowance to be-
18 come effective as provided for in subdivision (3) of
19 this section. Such allowance shall be determined in
20 accordance with the provisions of section five, or the
21 provisions of any other section governing superannua-
22 tion retirement applicable to such member upon the
23 basis of such member's age on the date when the re-
24 tirement allowance becomes effective, with an amount
25 of creditable service equal to that with which he was
26 credited on the date of his termination of service.
