AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SELECTMEN OF THE TOWN OF WALPOLE TO ACCEPT CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF LAW RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN WAR VETERANS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of
2 section sixty of chapter thirty-two of the General
3 Laws, the selectmen of the town of Walpole are hereby
4 authorized to accept sections fifty-six to fifty-nine,
5 inclusive, of said chapter thirty-two.
