RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF CHARLES R. BLEAKNEY, JR., OF
BROOKLINE.

1 *Resolved*, That for the purpose of discharging a
2 moral obligation of the commonwealth and after an
3 appropriation has been made therefor, there shall be
4 allowed and paid out of the state treasury to Charles
5 R. Bleakney, Jr., of Brookline, a minor who was
6 severely injured when struck by a state-owned motor
7 vehicle driven by a state employee in October, nine-
8 teen hundred and forty-eight, the sum of two thousand
9 dollars and an annuity of one thousand dollars an-
10 nually for a period of five years, said annuity pay-
11 ments to commence July first, nineteen hundred and
12 fifty-three. Said annuity shall cease upon the death
13 of said Bleakney if it occurs prior to the expiration of
14 said period of five years.
