## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

---

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Three.

---

AN ACT PROVIDING ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO COVER THE COST OF SEWERAGE WORKS WITHIN THE SOUTH METROPOLITAN SEWERAGE DISTRICT SERVING THE TOWN OF FRAMINGHAM.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would  
2 tend to defeat its purpose, therefore it is declared to  
3 be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate  
4 preservation of the public health, safety and con-  
5 venience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 527 of the acts of 1951 is hereby amended  
2 by striking out section 4 and inserting in place thereof  
3 the following:—

4 *Section 4.* To meet the expenditures necessary in  
5 carrying out the provisions of this act, the state treas-  
6 urer shall, from time to time on request of the com-  
7 mission and subject to the approval of the governor

8 and council, issue and sell at public or private sale  
9 bonds of the commonwealth, registered or with interest  
10 coupons attached, as he may deem best, to an amount  
11 not exceeding two million five hundred thousand dol-  
12 lars, in addition to the amount of such bonds author-  
13 ized for the construction of the south metropolitan  
14 sewerage system. Such bonds shall be designated on  
15 the face: — Metropolitan District Sewerage Loan, Act  
16 of 1951, shall be on the serial payment plan and shall  
17 be issued for such maximum term of years, not ex-  
18 ceeding thirty years from the date of issue, as may be  
19 recommended by the governor in accordance with  
20 section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the  
21 Constitution of the commonwealth, and shall bear in-  
22 terest at such rate as shall be fixed by the state treas-  
23 urer, with the approval of the governor.
