RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THE WHOLE MATTER OF MILK MARKETING AND THE ENFORCEMENT OF LAWS RELATING THERETO.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to
2 consist of one member of the senate, to be designated
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house
4 of representatives, to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof, and four persons to be appointed by the
6 governor of whom one shall be a milk producer whose
7 principal business shall be the production of milk, one
8 shall be a milk dealer whose principal business is the
9 sale and distribution of milk and cream, one shall be
10 a representative of a milk producers' co-operative, and
11 one shall represent the milk consuming public, is
12 hereby established for the purpose of making an in-
13 vestigation and study of the whole matter of milk
14 marketing and the proper enforcement of laws relating
15 thereto, particularly as set forth in so much of the
16 address of his excellency the governor, printed as
17 current senate document number one as relates to
18 a milk marketing commission. Said commission shall
19 be provided with quarters in the state house or else-
20 where, may hold public hearings, and shall have the
21 power to summon witnesses and to require the produc-
22 tion of books, records and papers, and the giving of
