## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Three.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR BIENNIAL RE-REGISTRATION OF PHYSICIANS, ESTABLISHING A FEE THEREFOR, AND PROVIDING FOR A BIENNIAL PUBLICATION BY THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN MEDICINE OF A LIST OF REGISTERED PHYSICIANS PRACTISING IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 112 of the General  
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 21 of  
3 chapter 585 of the acts of 1952, is hereby further  
4 amended by adding at the end the following para-  
5 graph:—

6 Each physician registered hereunder shall re-register  
7 biennially, before April first of each even-numbered  
8 year, and pay to the board a fee of five dollars.

1 SECTION 2. Section 2A of said chapter 112, as  
2 amended by section 3 of chapter 396 of the acts of  
3 1945, is hereby further amended by adding at the  
4 end the following sentence:— Each physician regis-  
5 tered hereunder shall re-register biennially, before  
6 April first of each even-numbered year and pay to  
7 the board a fee of five dollars.

1 SECTION 3. Section 4 of said chapter 112, as  
2 appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby  
3 amended by adding at the end the following sentence:  
4 — The board shall publish biennially complete lists  
5 of the names and office addresses of all physicians  
6 registered and practising in the commonwealth, ar-  
7 ranged alphabetically by name and also by the towns  
8 where their offices are situated.
