RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO PROVIDING FOR THE FURTHER PROTECTION OF CERTAIN CIVIL RIGHTS OF THE RESIDENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That the judicial council be requested to  
2 investigate the subject matter of section two of a  
3 proposed chapter one hundred and fifty-one D of the  
4 General Laws, contained in lines fifteen to forty-three,  
5 inclusive, of current house document numbered 1370,  
6 relative to providing for the further protection of the  
7 civil rights of the residents of the commonwealth,  
8 and to include its conclusions and its recommenda-  
9 tions, if any, in relation thereto, together with drafts  
10 of such legislation as may be necessary to give effect to  
11 the same, in its annual report for the year nineteen  
12 hundred and fifty-three.
