AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN LAND ADJACENT TO THE WHITEHALL STATE PARK IN THE TOWN OF HOPKINTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The commissioner of conservation, acting in behalf
2 of the commonwealth, may take by eminent domain,
3 under the provisions of chapter seventy-nine of the
4 General Laws, or may acquire by gift, purchase or
5 otherwise, certain land and buildings, deemed neces-
6 sary for recreational development, on the southerly
7 side of Wood street in the town of Hopkinton, ad-
8 jacent to the Whitehall State park.

9 Said land is bounded northerly by Wood street,
10 westerly by land of Vernon Rice and others, southerly
11 and easterly by land of the commonwealth, and
12 contains about thirty acres.
